It will also aim to provide opportunities for MSPs to hear directly from the sector and from children and young people themselves to ensure they can learn from their experiences.
 - This is in the public interest as it will create a key link between the sector and elected representatives. It will support better policy development and support organisations to share knowledge and learning with Scottish policy makers.
 - 3) We have identified a cross over with a range of existing Cross Party Groups, including those on learning disability, autism, mental health, LGBTI+ and outdoor education. We believe that

we have a specific role as we will look at these issues specifically in relation to children and young people. We will also take a broader look at the range of issues that affect children and young people and the sectors that work with them.

- 4) The group have a range of potential topics that we may explore, we have recently conducted a survey of members of the group and the following topics were identified:
- · Access to youth clubs
- The impact of lonlieness
- Connections with nature
- Next Steps for UNCRC Incorporation and the role of Parliament in the next phase
- Issues faced by young people from marginalised communities, including refugee/asylum seekers
- Education recovery
- Update on the Independent Review of Additional Support for Learning
- The Promise
- Trauma
- Mental Health
- Poverty
- Whole family approaches

At the most recent meeting of the group, the membership and the convenors also identified the following topics:

- Opportunities to be outdoors and connect with nature
- Access to youth work spaces, particularly in rural communities
- The pathways of care and the experiences of children and young people who have been referred to CAMHS
- Mental health and gender / Mental wellbeing and self confidence
- The CPG should work to gather views from children and young people who are rarely heard, including those in Armed Forces

The group will not be able to focus on all these topics across the year but the Secretariat will take away these suggestions and work with the convenors to develop a work plan for the coming year.
