The purpose of the Group is to inform MSPs and the wider Scottish Parliament about issues relating to rural policies and policy-making in Scotland.

The Group focuses on discussing topics of current and future relevance to the sustainability and wellbeing of Scotland's rural communities. This Group is strongly in the public interest given that rural areas make up 98% of the landmass of Scotland and 17% of the population (approximately 1 million people). Improving knowledge and understanding of the persistent challenges facing rural areas (e.g. depopulation, digital connectivity, etc.) and how to maximise the emerging opportunities (e.g. to sequester carbon, to develop innovative ways of delivering services, etc.) is critical to achieving a sustainable, just and inclusive Scotland.

We do not anticipate any overlaps with other Cross Party Groups. However, we are aware of the existence of several Cross Party Groups in related topics (e.g. Food, Towns and Town Centres, Crofting, Housing, etc.) and we will seek to engage with these Groups where appropriate (e.g. through attending their meetings, sharing information about our upcoming meetings with them, etc.). Four meetings of the Cross Party Group on Rural Policy will be held in 2021-22:

- Meeting 1: Tuesday 5<sup>th</sup> October 2021: Re-registering the Group, electing office bearers and Scotland's Climate Assembly Report and its implications for Rural Scotland
- Meeting 2: Tuesday 7<sup>th</sup> December 2021: Achieving sustainable rural tourism after the Covid-19 pandemic
- Meeting 3: Tuesday 8<sup>th</sup> March 2022: Topic TBC
- Meeting 4: Tuesday 7<sup>th</sup> June 2022: Topic TBC

All meetings will take place from 6-7.30pm with Meetings 1 and 2 (at least) taking place online using Microsoft Teams. From 2022 onwards, we hope that Group meetings can be held in a 'hybrid' way with inperson attendance at Parliament for those who wish/are able to travel and online attendance for those who do not wish to/cannot travel.
