Dedicated school transport service: school trips

< Meaning of "dedicated school transport service"

- (1) For the purpose of this Act, each of the following is a "dedicated school transport service"—
 - (a) a home-to-school transport service,
 - (b) a school trip transport service.
- (2) A "home-to-school transport service" is a transport service provided for the sole purpose of carrying pupils, for the whole or part of the journey, either or both—
 - (a) from the pupils' homes to any educational establishment where school education is provided for the pupils by a school authority,
 - (b) from any such establishment to the pupils' homes.
- (3) A "school trip transport service" is a transport service, other than a home-to-school transport service, provided for the sole purpose of carrying pupils for whom school education is provided by a school authority, for the whole or part of the journey, to or from a place where the pupils receive education or training (including to or from an educational establishment).>

 - <() At the same time as publishing the compliance statement, a school authority must publish a statement containing information about the steps which the authority is taking, in addition to the steps mentioned in subsection (2)—
 - (a) to promote the wearing of seat belts by pupils carried by the authority's dedicated school transport service,

(b) to monitor the wearing of seat belts by pupils carried by the authority's dedicated school transport service.>

<Guidance

- (1) A school authority must have regard to any guidance issued by the Scottish Ministers about the steps which a school authority may take—
 - (a) to promote the wearing of seat belts by pupils carried by the authority's dedicated school transport service,
 - (b) to monitor the wearing of seat belts by pupils carried by the authority's dedicated school transport service.
- (2) Before issuing such guidance, the Scottish Ministers must consult—
 - (a) each school authority,
 - (b) such others persons as they consider appropriate.
- (3) The Scottish Ministers must publish any such guidance.>
