- (1) The Scottish Ministers must prepare and publish an environmental policy strategy.
- (2) The purpose of the strategy is to—
 - (a) secure the maintenance of environmental standards at a level comparable to those applying before the United Kingdom withdrawal from the EU,
 - (b) secure the application of the guiding principles on the environment (within the meaning of section 9(1)) to all forms of public policy and decision making,
 - (c) secure the improved co-ordination and implementation of any public policy with an environmental objective.

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- (3) The strategy must contain—
 - (a) the Scottish Ministers' policies and proposals in relation to environmental policy and the protection and recovery of the natural environment,
 - (b) proposals for legislation to implement their policies and proposals.
- 15 (4) In preparing the strategy, the Scottish Ministers must consult—
 - (a) such Scottish public authorities, or bodies representative of the interest of such Scottish public authorities, as would be affected by the proposals,
 - (b) such organisations and individuals with expertise as appropriate to the strategy,

 - (5) Condition B is that Parliament resolved that it has lost confidence in the member's willingness, suitability or ability to perform that member's functions.
 - (6) A resolution under sub-paragraph (4)(b) or (5), must be voted for by a number of members not fewer than two thirds of the total number of seats for members of the Parliament.
 - (7) Each member of the Commission is entitled to—
 - (a) such remuneration, and
 - (b) such allowances,

as the Parliamentary corporation may determine.

- (8) In other respects, each member of the Commission hold office on such terms and conditions as the Parliamentary corporation may determine.
- (9) Those terms and conditions, without prejudice to paragraph 4—
 - (a) prohibit the member from holding any other specified office, employment or appointment or engaging in any other specified occupation,
 - (b) provide that a member's holding of any such office, employment or appointment or engagement in any such occupation is subject to the approval of the Parliamentary corporation,
 - (c) for the purposes of this sub-paragraph, provide differently for the member appointed to chair the Commission and the other members.

 - (a) introduce a Bill for an Act of the Scottish Parliament, or
 - (b) make, or lay before the Parliament a draft of, regulations in exercise of powers in an Act of Parliament or an Act of the Scottish Parliament.

- (1) The Scottish Ministers must no later than the end of the period of 12 months beginning with the day of Royal Assent—
 - (a) prepare proposals about the matters set out in subsection (2),
 - (b) consult on those proposals in accordance with subsection (3), and
 - (c) lay before the Scottish Parliament a report setting out a summary of—
 - (i) the comments received in response to the consultation, and
 - (ii) the Scottish Minsters' view on those comments and their proposals for action.
- (2) The matters referred to in subsection (1)(a) are—
 - (a) whether the provisions in this Act have ensured that there continues to be effective and appropriate governance relating to the environment following the withdrawal of the United Kingdom from the EU,
 - (b) whether the law in Scotland on access to justice on environmental matters is effective and sufficient, and
 - (c) whether and in what form an environmental court should be established to enhance the governance arrangements referred to in paragraph (a).
